

Eloquent Protest IV: 2009

Since its Trafalgar Studio launch in 2006, Feelgood's *Eloquent Protest* has quickly become one of the most important and moving events in London's theatrical calendar. For the fourth year, alongside an array of acclaimed artists, veteran peace campaigner Tony Benn will once again host the event.

For generations artists, writers, poets and singers have raised their voices in eloquent protest against the human cost of war. Owen, Hardy, Pablo Casals, Bob Dylan, John Lennon, Joan Baez, Adrian Mitchell and David Harsent to name but a few, along with a whole generation of new artists, have added their voices to those of innocent civilians like Anne Frank and the children of Terezin who yearned for a peaceful world through their words and music.

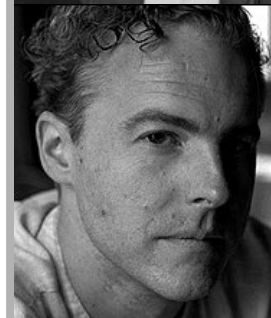
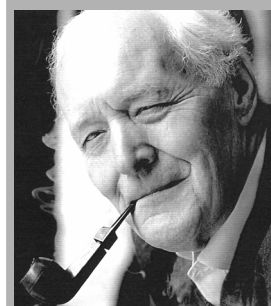
